Chad is a 28 year veteran of law enforcement in South Africa. He is the recipient of the security industry's 2019 bravery award, as well the security industry gold medal for bravery awarded in 1998. He was nominated for the Mail & Guardian Driver's of Change Award. Chad was the host of the radio show "Corruption Busters" which won the Best Daytime Radio Show in South Africa award in 2017; and is currently the host of the actuality radio show "Confidential Brief" on ChaiFM.
